

AMERICAN LEGION POST 58 SINGLE A BASEBALL

Parent Information for 2025 Season

1. Season Overview

We're excited to kick off another great summer of baseball!

We are a part of the Area 3 Single A Willamette Valley League that include teams from Newberg, Corvallis, Crescent Valley, West and South Albany, and Dallas. Playing against these strong Legion programs will push us to grow, improve, and compete at our best.

All home games and practices will be held at **McNary High School**. We're grateful for the opportunity to use this great facility and want to treat it with care and respect. <u>All players</u> will be expected to participate in field maintenance after every game and practice to help keep the field in top condition.

We'll begin the season with several practices during the first two weeks. After that, our practice schedule will be adjusted week to week based on our game load. Due to the high volume of games in a short timeframe (averaging 4–5 games per week), practices will become limited or paused once the season is in full swing.

2. Key Dates

Once tryouts are complete and teams have been selected, we will hold our first team practice and distribute jerseys on **Wednesday**, **June 4 from 5–7pm at McNary**. Our season officially kicks off with a doubleheader on **Sunday**, **June 8**, also at McNary. We'll face **Crescent Valley at 2pm and Corvallis at 5pm**.

In addition to league games, we'll be participating in several non-league games and key events this summer. The Thurston Tournament will take place **June 27–29** at Thurston High School. If we qualify, we'll compete in the State Tournament, scheduled for **July 23–28** at Eagle Point High School in Medford. Teams that advance past state will move on to the Regional Tournament, held **August 6–11**, with the location still to be determined.

3. Player Fee & Gear Requirements

The \$400 player fee helps cover the cost of a black team jersey, hat, league and tournament fees, baseballs, and other program expenses. Each player will need to supply their own **black belt**, **white knickers/black socks** or **straight-leg pants**, and **personal baseball equipment** (glove, bat, helmet, cleats, etc.).

Player fees can be submitted directly to the team manager by cash or check (preferred). Please make checks payable to: American Legion Post 58.

4. Travel & Transportation

All league games will take place in the Willamette Valley, with teams from **Newberg**, **Corvallis, Crescent Valley, West Albany, South Albany, and Dallas**. In addition to league play, we've scheduled a few non-league games – most within the Willamette Valley. At this time, the furthest travel during the regular season will be to Springfield for the Thurston Tournament, held at the end of June.

Parents and guardians are responsible for transportation to and from all games, practices, and events. Any coordination of carpools or shared travel is at the discretion of each family. Should we qualify for State or Regional Tournaments, additional travel details and logistics will be shared at that time.

5. Communication

All players are required to download the GameChanger app and update their availability <u>the day before each game or tournament</u>. This helps our coaching staff plan lineups and ensure we're fully prepared for each event.

We also encourage parents and guardians to download the GameChanger app to follow the team's schedule, get updates, ask questions, and live game information. If needed, communicating availability directly to the team manager via email or text is also acceptable any time.

6. Expectations & Culture

We understand that many players come from high school programs with strong team culture and close-knit camaraderie. Joining a new team with unfamiliar faces can feel challenging at first. That's why one of our top priorities this summer is to build a positive, inclusive team environment while focusing on player development. Our goal is for every athlete to get significant reps in both practices and games, helping them grow in confidence, skill, and game awareness.

We want each player to leave this season better prepared for future levels of Legion ball and excited to return next year.

Our expectations for players are simple: **give full effort on and off the field** and maintain a **team-first attitude in everything they do**, and work to **develop an elite mindset**.

While we are competing in a league schedule with the potential to qualify for the state tournament, playing time may vary slightly from game to game. However, we are committed to ensuring that every player receives meaningful opportunities throughout the season. If questions or concerns about playing time arise, we ask that players first speak directly with the team manager. Should a situation require further discussion, we'll involve parents as needed on a case-by-case basis.

With larger rosters, balancing playing time can be a challenge, but we are committed to doing everything we can to create a fair, developmental, and competitive experience for everyone.

7. Volunteer or Support Opportunities

We're always grateful for parent support, and there are a few key areas where we could use assistance this summer:

Scorekeeping – If you're familiar with the GameChanger app – or would like to learn – we'd love your help keeping score during games.
